Through enactment by the 1960 Alaska State Legislature provision was made for the establishment of advisory school boards to assist and advise the State Board of Education and the State Department of Education. The intent of this Act was to allow for some degree of local policy determination in an advisory capacity in those areas where schools are maintained solely by the State of Alaska. The law provided for the advisory board to consist of three members in each area served by a rural school operated by the State Department of Education.

The election of these members to the Homer Board was held on October 10, 1960. Since this election was the first advisory school board election, the term of each member was determined by the drawing of three numbers, one by each member. The person drawing number one, Mr. Kolar, shall serve the remainder of the 1960-61 year to April, 1961, plus one full year ending in April, 1962. The member drawing number two, Ed Rehder, shall serve the remainder of the 1960-61 year, plus two full years ending in April, 1963. The member drawing number three, Milton Turkington, shall serve the remainder of the 1960-61, plus three full years ending April, 1964.

Mr. Kolar was named as chairman of the group, and Mr. Turkington as secretary.
