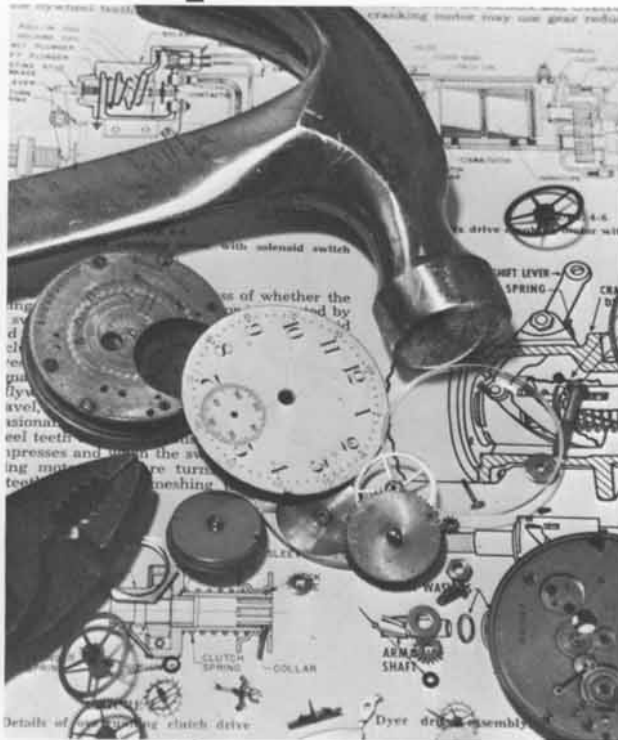

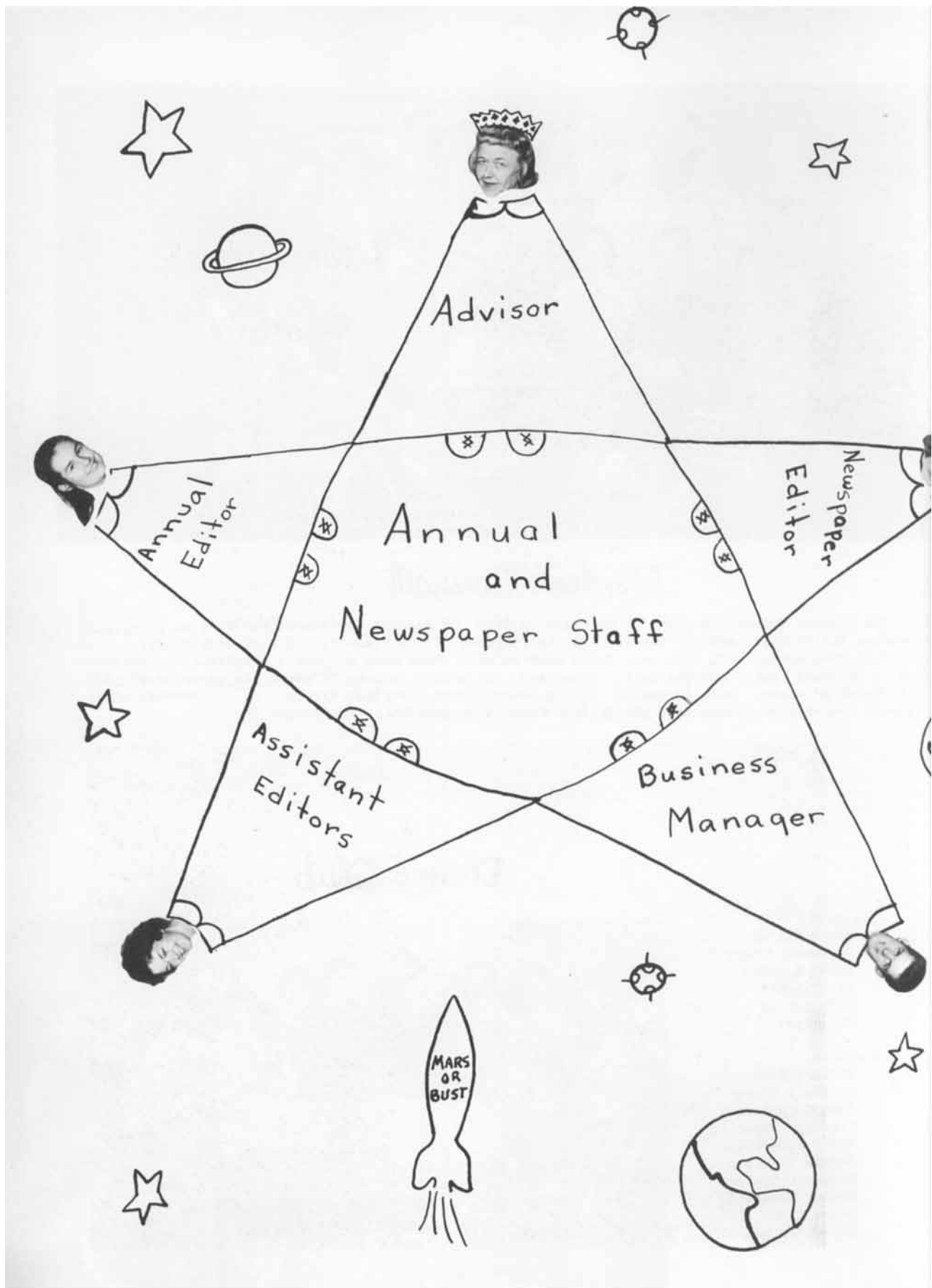

As a result of the National Defense Education Act, funds are available from the federal government to public schools in the areas of science, math and foreign languages. The government pays 50 per cent cost of the items purchased; the independent school district or the state department of education pays the remainder. Our language laboratory now utilizes more than \$7,000 of equipment, and future plans include making it available to every student in the elementary schools, in addition to high school language students.

The language laboratory makes it possible for students to hear Spanish spoken by native speakers of many Latin-American countries. They hear their voices as they repeat the Spanish, and for additional practice, sit at tape recorders to record their voices and compare their pronunciation with the native speakers.

A wide variety of tapes, records, and filmstrips give the students an opportunity to test their ability to understand Spanish as spoken by speakers from different areas. Several textbooks are used to develop reading ability. Grammar is learned by oral practice of structure drills, followed by written exercises.

Funds for the language laboratory come from the federal government as a result of the Act.

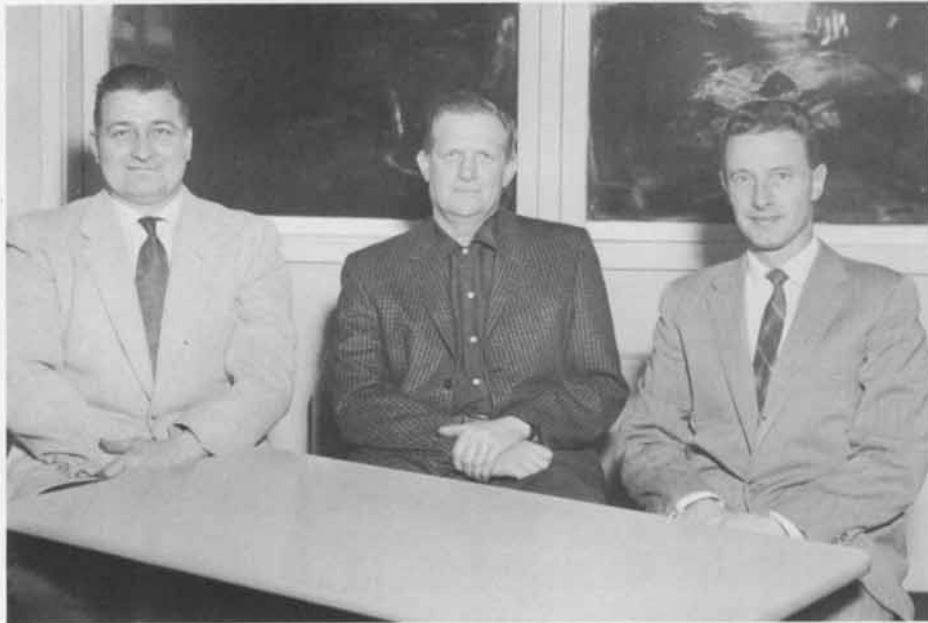
