ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS

— HOMER —

EARLY INHABITANTS WERE ATHAPASCAN INDIANS WHO LEFT WHEN THE CARIBOU MIGRATED. RUSSIAN FUR TRADERS EXPLORED KACHEMAK, DERIVED FROM ALEUT WORD MEANING "HIGH CLIFFS", BAY AREA IN 18TH CENTURY. IN 1890 AN ENGLISH COMPANY BEGAN MINING COAL. A RAILROAD OPERATED UNTIL 1907, WAS BUILT TO A PIER AT THE END OF THE SPIT TO SUPPLY COAL TO WHALERS AND ORIENT BOUND STEAMERS. FIRE DESTROYED WAREHOUSES AND OTHER BUILDINGS IN 1934. JOHN R. BRADLEY DISCOVERED A COMMERCIAL VEIN OF COAL IN 1878 NEAR MCNEIL CANYON. IT WAS LATER DETERMINED THERE ARE 400,000,000 TONS OF COAL WITHIN 1/2 MILE OF THE HOMER BEACH. IN 1898, LED BY HOMER PENNOCK, FOR WHOM THE TOWN IS NAMED, 75 PEOPLE OF ALASKA GOLD MINING COMPANY WINTERED ON THE SPIT. SINCE 1915 HOMER'S ECONOMY HAS BEEN FOR FARMING AND FISHING. THE 4 1/2 MILE SPIT, WITH PORT FACILITIES, IS A MAJOR ATTRACTION.




