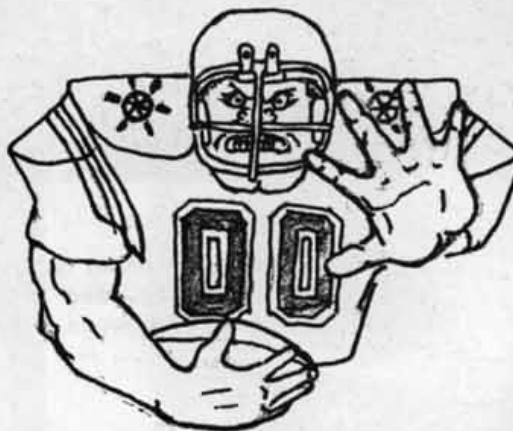
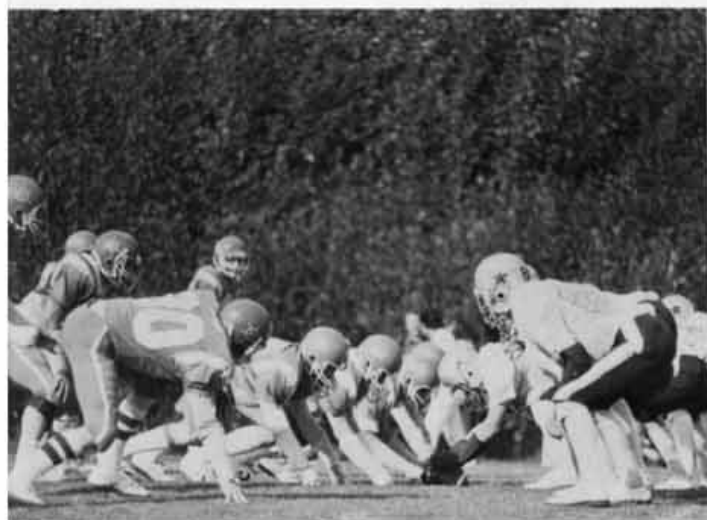
# FOOTBALL

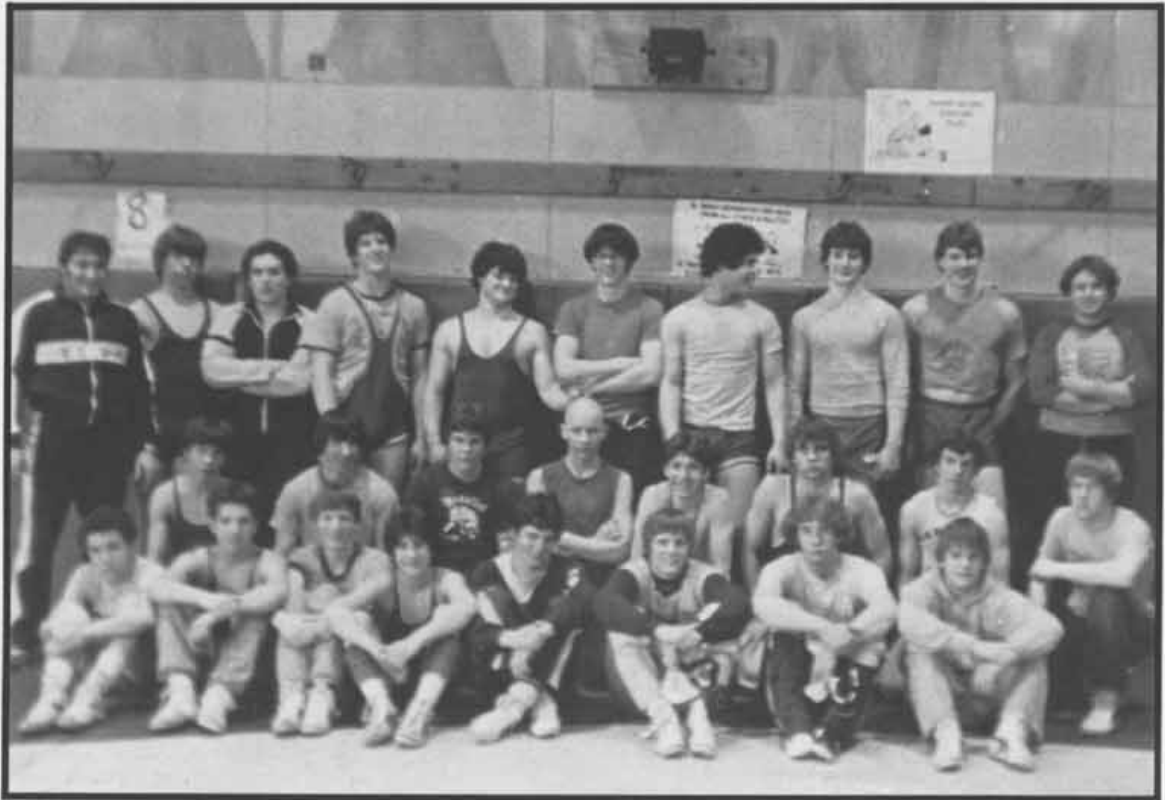

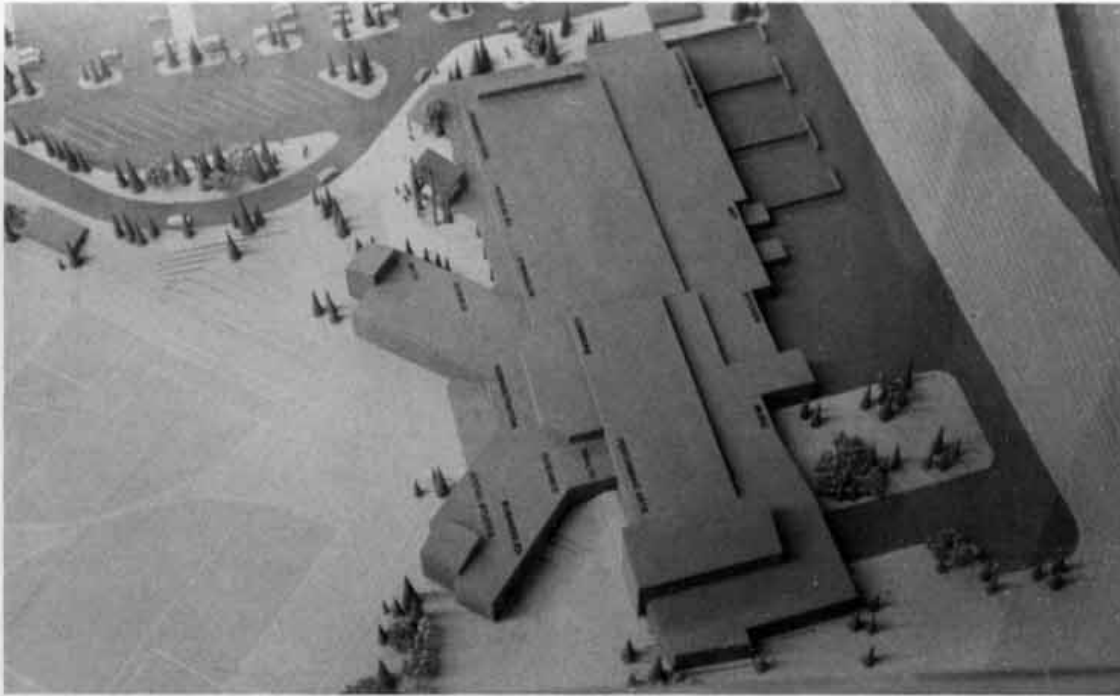
### THE NEW HOMER HIGH SCHOOL
